Cedar City - The City Council is opening some streets to all-terrain vehicle riders who want to reach popular trails. Opponents are worried about noise and traffic and question whether police will be able to enforce the new law. The ordinance creates a map for ATV riders, requires adult supervision for children 12 to 16 and sets a curfew of one hour after sunset.

Thursday, May 10

Kaysville - The Utah Department of Transportation is planting gardens along Interstate 15 and other state roads with plants that produce seed oil that can be used to make biodiesel. The goal is to create enough of the fuel to keep UDOT's fleet of about 1,000 vehicles running.

Wednesday, May 9

Orem - In order to make the change from Utah Valley State to Utah Valley University, the school in Orem needs to fill 90 positions by this fall. The school is scheduled to become a university by July 2008, and the hiring would lower the ratio of classes taught by adjunct faculty. Positions include 40 faculty members as well as support staff. The school has started a nationwide search and says qualified adjunct faculty can apply.

Tuesday, May 8

Salt Lake City - An advocacy group has written a brochure that gives tips and phone numbers for illegal immigrants who fear being caught and deported. Among the advice: Carry a valid identification and not false documents. Proyecto Latino de Utah, an advocacy group in Salt Lake City, plans to distribute 10,000 copies at stores, churches and community centers. It was written in Spanish but will be translated into English and Portuguese.

Monday, May 7

Salt Lake City - The University of Utah has identified 4,000 students who have at least 90 of the 122 credit hours needed for a bachelor's degree, and the school wants them back. Some fees would be waived, and returning students would get academic advice, child care and career help, the university said.
